



Eduardo Jany directs Security Operations for Bloomberg, LP in the Americas responsible for protection of personnel and assets at more than forty sites. He has provided security and law enforcement consulting and engaged in operational readiness and interoperability projects for public safety agencies worldwide with special emphasis on Brazil for the 2014 World Cup and 2016 Olympic Games. He was born in São Paulo, Brazil, immigrated with his family to the U.S. and is fully fluent in Portuguese and Spanish.

Eduardo retired from police service as a Captain in the metropolitan Seattle, WA area and has experience in police leadership, management and operations serving more than 20 years in Florida, Minnesota and Washington State. He served in command, canine, SWAT, mounted patrol, homicide task forces, narcotics, training and investigations, and holds over a dozen law enforcement Instructor certifications. He is a frequent lecturer and guest instructor at courses and conferences including NTOA, IACP, INTERSEG and ASIS and has participated in nearly 100 advisory and training details. Eduardo attended the University of Minnesota completing four years of undergraduate study and holds a Master's in Criminal Justice from the University of Wisconsin, Platteville. He was a 2014 Senior Executive Fellow at the Harvard University - Kennedy School of Government and completed the Kennedy School National and International Security Senior Executive Program; the National Defense University RC National Security Program, and is a graduate of the United States Marine Corps Command and Staff College.

He enlisted in the Army at age 17, was commissioned as an Infantry officer and later attended the Special Forces Qualification and the Civil Affairs Officer Advanced Courses and was awarded the Special Forces Branch. Eduardo served in Special Forces as an SFODA Detachment Executive Officer, IMA Officer, and as counter-narcotics Detachment Commander and Instructor at the School of the Americas. He entered the Marine Corps in 1999 and served in Team, Company and Battalion Command and Division Staff assignments with deployments in Reconnaissance, as an NCIS FCI operations investigator and Foreign Liaison Officer and in Joint Special Operations assignments. He was also an Anti-Terrorism and Force Protection Advisor and coordinated and led numerous threat and vulnerability assessments. He served as the Commanding officer of the largest Battalion in the Marine Corps, the Anti-Terrorism Battalion with over 1,200 Marines located at eleven sites and forward deployed in six different time zones and retired as a full Colonel after 33 years of combined active and reserve duty.

His awards include the Bronze Star Medal, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Joint Meritorious Service Medal, several US and foreign awards and the Police Medal of Valor and Officer of the Year-Excellence in Service Award.

He is married and has a baby boy and resides in New York City.
